5.38 SYSTEM OF AWARDING CREDIT Education Committee

POLICY:

It is the policy of the International Association of Forensic Nurses (IAFN) to comply with the American Nurses Credentialing Center's (ANCC) guidelines for awarding credit for educational activities.

PROCEDURE:

Educational learning sessions may be live/enduring activities or independent learning activities, each of which will meet the ANCC guidelines for contact hours.

Live/Enduring Activities will qualify for contact hours as determined by the amount of time spent in organized learning and evaluation.

- 1. Contact hours are the appropriate ANCC unit of measure for an organized learning activity.
- 2. A contact hour consists of 60 minutes of organized learning.
 - a. The organized learning activity can be didactic or clinical.
 - b. The evaluation may be considered part of the learning activity and may be included in calculating the number of contact hours.
- 3. There is no minimum number of contact hours which may be awarded.
- 4. Contact hours can be awarded in tenths or hundredths; hundredths can be rounded down to tenths, but never rounded up.
- 5. Contact hour determination for live activities will follow the formula listed below:
 - Divide the total number of minutes of a presentation time (may also add the time for evaluation) by 60 minutes (the length of a contact hour)
 - For example: 90 minutes of presentation time plus 10 minutes of evaluation time = 100 minutes divided by 60 minutes = 1.66 [or 1.6] contact hours

Independent Learning Activities will qualify for contact hours determined by pilot testing the activity and then calculating the specific number of contact hours.

- 1. Pilot testing will be conducted according to ANCC guidelines.
- 2. Pilot testers will be representative of the target audience and the number of testers will be based upon the purpose and design of the activity.
- 3. Pilot testing will be conducted with each tester as follows:
 - a. A full learning package, including all requirements is provided for each tester to complete.
 - b. Each tester is instructed to:
 - i. Record the time it took to complete the learning package.
 - ii. Complete the package in one session.
 - iii. Complete the evaluation, which includes attesting to the effectiveness of the pilot testing design and teaching/learning resources.
 - iv. Provide additional information concerning the testing if requested.

- 4. Evaluation of the pilot test
 - a. A summary of the pilot tester's evaluations will be reviewed to determine if all objectives were met.
 - b. Feedback from pilot testers will provide data for adjustments to the teaching/learning materials.
 - c. If feedback leads to major revisions in the teaching/learning materials, a new pilot test will be conducted following the revisions.
- 5. Contact hour determination is based on results of the pilot test by the following method:
 - The total amount of time spent by all the pilot testers is divided by the number of pilot testers, which equals the average number of minutes to complete the activity.
 - For example: The total amount of time to complete the package =1,229 minutes, divided by 10 pilot testers [1229 minutes divided by 10] =122.90 minutes. 122.90 minutes divided by 60 minutes (the length of a contact hour) = 2.04 contact hours
