Dr. Jocelyn C. Anderson is a forensic nurse with over 15 years of experience in clinical care, research, and education. She has been a member of IAFN since 2008, serving in multiple leadership roles at the chapter, Foundation, and Association level. She has served as the IAFN and IAFN Foundation Treasurer since 2023. She is currently an Associate Professor at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences (UAMS) and works clinically as a telehealth sexual assault nurse examiner with the UAMS teleSANE team. As a researcher she has led and collaborated on projects funded by the National Institutes of Health, National Institute of Justice, Johns Hopkins Urban Health Institute, Sigma, and others. She works collaboratively with multidisciplinary colleagues to develop research that aims to understand the health impacts of violence and how health care providers and systems can improve the health and justice outcomes for our patients. In 2017 she was selected as the recipient of IAFN's Ann Burgess Research Award. As an educator she has taught undergraduate students in an Introduction to Forensic Nursing course, graduate student research and evidence-based practice courses, and mentored numerous students and clinicians in the conduct of research to advance the science of forensic nursing.
